

## Results of survey on systems for personal information protection in foreign countries

This survey is intended to investigate and disclose the systems, etc. concerning the protection of personal information in foreign countries to which we provide personal information, etc. (excluding countries that have been surveyed and announced by the Personal Information Protection Commission Japan), and to inform the relevant individuals in advance of the survey.

In accordance with the survey policy published by the Personal Information Protection Commission Japan, we will conduct this survey based on the following principles.

### 1. Existence of a legal system for the protection of personal information

Existence of comprehensive personal information protection laws and regulations.

### 2. Existence of information that could serve as a "certain indicator" of the system for the protection of personal information in the foreign country concerned.

Whether or not the country has obtained the EU's adequacy decision or is a member of the APEC CBPR.

### 3. "Essential differences" from Japan's personal information protection system

Existence of provisions in the laws and regulations identified in **1.** that are applicable to the eight principles of the OECD Privacy Guidelines.

### 4. Other details of other systems that may have a significant impact on the rights and interests of the individual

Whether or not there is a direct obligation to retain personal information collected in the region, or whether or not the government is required by law to provide personal information to the government for criminal law enforcement purposes or national security purposes, if the government has access to personal information held by private purposes or national security purposes, if the government has access to personal information held by private entities for either or both of these purposes.
